Project Description: Tear out old soffit and fascia, install attic vents, install new perforated aluminum soffit and fascia, replace damaged rain gutters, all in order to stop ice damming on roof, install wainscoting and new baseboards to corridor walls, patch prime and painting corridor walls, lobby, and hallway side only, of suite doors.

Anticipated Outcome: The roof ventilation system is based on the recommendations of a professional as there is ice buildup in the valleys and then beneath the sidewalks. This will allow for more circulation and a substantial cost savings for future. e.g.. roof repairs, leaks, mold, etc. as well as improve the safety for the tenants during the winter months. The repairs and detail work to the inside of the hallways and doors would keep the common areas looking clean and desirable, and a viable choice for housing for seniors that have had to downsize their present accommodations. Golden & Area A's Vital Signs Report, listed affordable housing as #3 priority by the local citizens, but if this location is not well maintained, Purcell View Apartments will not be a desirable choice for affordable independent-living housing.

Actual Outcome: There will be less ice build up in the roof valleys and no resulting damage to roof, the sidewalks beneath will not be as slippery and unsafe, as well, the concrete will not be as vulnerable to damage due to winter conditions. The repairs will allow for increased air circulation and substantial costs savings in the future re:roof repair,leaks, mold, heating costs etc. The snow stops will prevent the snow from sliding and covering windows and exits, as well as preventing excess weight on the roof edges which were compromising the roof overhang. The hallway repair, paint and detail have enhanced the appearance making the building more esthetically pleasing to tenants and improving presentation when showing to potential tenants and their families. Purcell View Apartments, now present as a well maintained alternative for senior's affordable housing.

Anticipated Outcome: Research indicates that access to early learning and care services has positive short and long term benefits to individual children, families and communities. According to the Early Development Instrument (EDI) data available through the University of British Columbia, Golden's children measure poorly relative to the provincial average. Golden's ELCSAG acknowledges that in developing an early learning hub we will address the immediate community need for child care spaces as well as provide complimentary services that support equitable access to healthy opportunities in the early years. By building Golden's community capacity it is anticipated that the Early Development Instrument scores in Golden will improve and the vulnerability of our children will be reduced. The high vulnerability scores of our community and the need for increased child care spaces are both sighted in the 2012 Golden and Area 'A' Vital Signs report.

Actual Outcome: The outcome of this project is to construct an Early Learning and Care Centre as an addition to Alexander Park Elementary School. During this phase of development we have successfully procured professional conceptual plans and construction drawings. This is a critical piece of project development. These plans will be used in all future grant applications and demonstrate to funders the scope of our project and an opportunity to visualize the centre as it will be built.

Anticipated Outcome: The outcome of this project is to provide food to those in Golden that face food insecurity every day. Community donations of food will be supplemented with food sharing from the Inter-Faith Food Bank as well as regular purchases of food. The emphasis of food purchased will be to provide foods that are nutrient dense to supplement what other items are available. Many food banks face food shortages and are forced to turn people away until such time as food stocks can be replenished. This project ensures the Golden Food Bank is not in the same position. Success will be measured by the number of food hampers distributed to those in need in Golden. Success will be measured by the number of volunteers that ensure shelves are stocked and hampers are available to those in need. Statistics will be collected throughout this project and shared in the Final Report.

Actual Outcome: In 2013, food hampers supported an average of 128 households in the community every month representing 4% of the population of Golden and Area A. Success was measured by the demonstration of need shown in these statistics for this valuable service. Success was measured by the 27 volunteers that provided over 2000 hours of time between May and December of 2013 ensuring those in need in the community were fed. Success was measured by the Food Bank's ability to purchase protein and dairy items for food hampers. The Food Bank maximized funds from this grant increasing our buying power for every dollar spent. For many clients food received from the Golden Food Bank makes the difference between having enough to feed themselves and/or their families going hungry.

Project Title: Power Pole Replacement
Program: Community Initiatives

Project Description: The Golden Golf Club maintains 35 power poles to the facility. Our responsibility starts at the junction kicking Horse drive / Golf Course dr. This is a large responsibility for the golf club to maintain and operate the power line system to the golf club. Our goal is to continue to upgrade our power pole system to BC hydro standards in a process to have BC Hydro take over the responsibilities of a majority of the power line system. Currently in our power system maintenance and operation we have 4 poles that have been identified in 2009 that will be in need of replacement. The scope of the project will include:
 Test and treatment of all the power poles as part of our 5 year monitoring program. This is termed Consultant "phase 1"
 Pole Replacement of the poles that need to be replaced from prior testing. These poles have been temporarily stubbed 5 years ago to prolong the poles lifespan which is typically 5 years.

The Tests and Treat was completed and deemed all the other poles on the property to be structurally sound and will be tested again in 6-8 years. The 3 poles replaced in October was completed without any problems.

 2. Potentially less pet cats going missing (unsterilized cats will travel farther from home in search of a mate) - this will be measured through community feedback.

Actual Outcome: The program resulted in 75 cats being sterilized. These were cats that otherwise would not have been spayed or neutered, which very likely would have led to unwanted kittens. Success was measured simply by the number of approved applications, and use of those vouchers handed out. Once we were informed that the voucher was submitted to a vet's office, we could be sure that those particular animals were no longer at risk to contributing more babies to the cat population in this area.
